

"Cracking Pebble"



One of the reasons for this is lack of play, as there are only evening draws and sometimes only one draw a night in the old building. We tried a number of things last year to solve this problem, one of which was cracking the pebble before play started. Cracking is done after pebbling and before play begins by dragging a set of rocks up one side of the sheet and down the other, then reversing the process. This rounds off the pebble across the entire ice surface and allows the rocks to run a little easier, hopefully making the first few ends more enjoyable for us all.

As this procedure is quite time consuming, it will be done for the first draw of the night only. So the next time you see staff dragging rocks up and down the ice in the old building you'll understand why.

The Canadian Club Professional Championship sponsored by the Canadian Golf Equipment & Manufacturers Association is it a serious golf competition, a relaxing break for golf professionals during the busy summer months or a combination of both?

To some of the top-flight players it is nothing but a golf championship. To others golf is secondary to the relaxing atmosphere at the tournament. But to the vast majority of club professionals who make the journey to the championship each year, the event is a definite combination of both.

It is an opportunity for club professionals to concentrate on their game away from the daily duties of the club. No lessons. no staff supervisory duties - nothing but golf.

This year's championship at the Prince George Golf & Curling Club in Prince George, B.C. fit the mould to a tee. Seventyfive club professionals from across Canada travelled to the picturesque city to be greeted by a friendly club membership, a well-run clubhouse and pro shop and, most importantly, a course worthy of hosting a Canadian championship.

While the club entertained the professionals and provided the relaxing atmosphere, golf took centre stage. From Scott Knapp's blazing 64 in the Pro-Am to Cec Ferguson's four-under-par 67 on the final day to clinch the title, the residents of Prince George witnessed an outstanding display of golf.

Ferguson carted off the first-prize cheque of \$5,000 with rounds of 71-70-67 for a 54-hole total of five-under-par 208. His strong play over the tough Prince George layout earned him a three-shot victory.

To avoid further confusion and distortion, the Committee moved

"that effective January 1, 1987, we do not accept scores from outside Canada for the calculation of handicaps."

This was subsequently approved by the RCGA Board of Governors at a meeting on November 1, 1986.
