

From the Superintendent

Presently a number of cutting changes are being made to the golf course. The fringes on holes No. 1, No. 6, No. 9, No. 10, No. 11, No. 15, and No. 18 are being reduced to one mower width around the green. One mower width is approximately 6 feet. In the past, the fringe extended out around the sand-traps on these holes. The reason the fringes are being altered is two fold. First is that grass cut at 2 inches develops a deeper root system promoting healthier turf which can tolerate more wear caused by traffic. Second is that sand and small stones from the traps is very hard on the reel mower greatly increasing the amount of maintenance required by the machine used to cut fringes. By allowing the grass to grow to a height of 2 inches, the sand and small stones fall between the blades of grass thus not affecting the reel mowers.

Cutting changes are also being made to the fairways on holes No. 1, No. 2, No. 6, No. 9, No. 11, No. 16, and No. 18. The landing area is being increased to approximately 40 yards in width from approximately 30 yards. The landing area starts at approximately 200 yards and will extend to approximately 250 yards. On holes No. 9, No. 16, and No. 18 the fairway from 250 to 270 has been reduced to 25 yards in width.

These cutting changes have been made to increase the amount on contour we have in our fairway and improve the asthetics of the golf course. The larger landing area also promotes the concept of target golf where placement of the ball at a desired location is rewarded by having a larger area cut as fairway to receive the ball.

The white dotted lines that you may have noticed on the golf course represent the new edge of the fairway. The lines were put in place so that my crew knows exactly where the edge of the fairway is going to be so that each area can be cut at the desired height with the desired machine.

The Ladies Simon Fraser Open

Plans are well underway for our 1987 tournament, which is sponsored this year by Nicholson Chev Olds. The dates are August 8th and 9th, entry fee is \$47.00, and \$52.00 for the "Silver Belle" Section (ladies 50 and over).

There will be a practice round on Friday, August 7th, with registration at 7:00 p.m., followed by our traditional wine and cheese reception hosted this year by International Potter Distilling. Back by popular demand will be the steak barbeque on Saturday evening.

The Junior Girls are invited to enter The Simon this year and will be required to pay the \$47.00 entry fee. There will be no separate tournament within The Simon for them.

As explained earlier, the Golf Committee is endeavouring to standardize all major golf tournaments, and has asked that we change our format on a trial basis, to designated prizes instead of "pick of the table". We are also attempting to purchase the same prize for the same winner of each flight. This method makes prize selection much easier for the people purchasing and will certainly accelerate the prize presentation on Sunday afternoon, when out of town guests are anxious to leave. The other change in our format will also be with the prizes. We have five flights and each flight will have:

- One 36 hole low gross winner
- Five 36 hole low net winners

Instead of:

- One 36 hole low gross winner
- Five low gross for Saturday & five low gross for Sunday
- Five low net for Saturday & five low net for Sunday

This method will greatly simplify and speed up the scoring process—the number of prizes distributed will be the same as in previous years.

I feel these excellent and timely suggestions will streamline our tournament, and have therefore agreed to cooperate with the Golf Committee this year. If I'm wrong and they are found to be unsuitable and ineffective to our needs, next year's Chairman should feel free to make further adjustments.

Thanks so far to Nicholson Chev Olds, International Potter Distilling, The Citizen, CJCI, Al Wells, Barb Guest, Georgie Cleland and Jessie Cunliffe.

Congratulations to the top 8 junior golfers who qualified for the Junior Club Championship Match Play.


