



From the Superintendent

Work has begun on the Golf Course and first observations of its condition look good. A snow cover of 6½" was removed from the greens revealing little ice build-up, a problem which has plagued us for the past two years. Nine of the greens have been covered with synthetic tarps. These covers are intended to help warm the ground and when temperatures of 50—60 degrees F are reached, spring green-up should be greatly enhanced. Opening day is not far off, however the exact date depends entirely on the type of weather we receive over the next couple of weeks. Hopefully sunshine and above normal temperatures will dominate not only the month of April, but the entire summer of 1988.

Golf Committee

The Club is presently having new score cards printed for the up-coming Golf Season. The cards will feature a different format with a few changes being implimented on the card. Under Local Rules the following changes have been made:

- WATER HAZARDS Creek in front of #16 and the pond on #3 are water hazards.
- FREE LIFT Paths, roadways, that are asphalt or limestone and flowerbeds. Drop nearest relief not nearer hole-one club length no penalty.
- 3) FENCE When playing #7, where a player's swing or stance are interfered with by the fence along side #7 green, a player may elect to drop his/her ball in the drop area provided or proceed under the rules of golf.

The Golf Course was rated in 1987 and the Men's yardages have been changed. As a result, the following is a list of the new yardages:




