Irrigation

With the addition of the new well last summer, an abundance of water is available for irrigation. Normal irrigation cycles are run during the night so as not to interfere with golfers and maintenance activities; however, the hot, sunny days of summer require more water than 8 hours of night time watering can provide.

Upwards of 500,000 gallons per day are needed to provide peak soil moisture levels. This enormous amount of water can only be supplied by continuous 24 hour per day watering.

I sincerely hope you find this inconvenience minimal, knowing that it is necessary to keep our golf course green and growing.


