## From the Superintendent

The New Year has arrived and for those of us involved in the Turf industry, the months of January, February and March provide us with the opportunity to attend one of the many Turfgrass Conferences held throughout Canada and the U.S.

This year I will be attending the Western Canada Turfgrass Conference in Victoria. The conference includes three days of lectures and discussions by prominent turfgrass scientists and professors, product and equipment displays, social events including a dinner and dance and hopefully some free time to sneak in a round of golf.

The 1988 agenda includes an address by Dr. Jan Wiejer, Professor of Genetics at the University of Alberta, regarding his program for producing new grass varieties which need limited maintenance.

World-wide media coverage has made such claims as "beautiful" green grass needing mowing once per year, which is drought resistant, needs no fertilizer and is self weeding. Sounds great. You won't have to play around mowers on the golf course and when you're finished your game, you won't have to rush home to cut your front lawn. The grass, which will be sold for 30 per cent more than most grass seed, should be ready for marketing in about four years.
