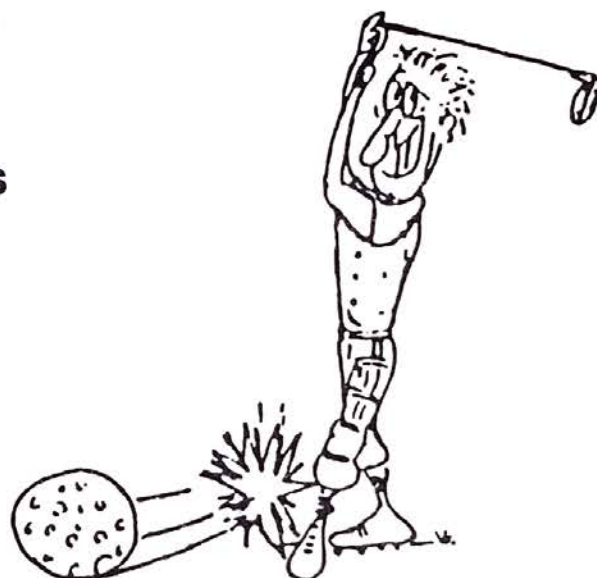

From the Superintendent

A recent visit was made to our golf course by Dr. Doug Taylor, an agronomist who spent many years working at the Agassiz Research Centre and who now serves as an R.C.G.A. consultant. Dr. Taylor made an on-site inspection of our golf course and was most impressed with the improvements that have been made since his last visit back in the late 70's.

A full report of general considerations and recommendations will be prepared and sent to us and I will summarize and pass on this information to you at a later date.

We still have a number of areas on the course to aerate and topdress. All tees and fringes as well as areas of rough require aeration at least twice yearly to ensure good drainage, relieve compaction and encourage new seed germination. We hope you will bear with us as we perform these essential turf maintenance practices.

A Simple Tip on Chipping

When taking your stance make sure you are slightly open, your toes should line up to about 10 o'clock compared to your target. Make sure you spread your weight evenly on BOTH feet, THEN shift your weight to the left side. You now have a much better foundation on which to chip with, rather than stepping up and putting your weight on your left side right away.

From the Green Committee

The Green Committee would like to take this opportunity to inform the Membership of the time frame in which the new 17th green will be open for play. Work in 1989 will consist of the following:

1. Construction of the retaining wall
2. Grading of the subsurface to desired slopes
3. Construction of the green to U.S.G.A. Specifications
4. Grading of the surface material to desired slopes
5. Installation of irrigation line

The area will then be left to settle over the winter. In the spring of 1990 the final grading will take place and the area seeded to establish turf cover.

The earliest the green would be opened for play would be the late fall of 1990. More likely than not the green would be opened for play in the 1991 golf season.

Construction of this green has been talked about for a long time and it is the Green Committee's desire to see the project complete in a manner that will enhance the aesthetics and quality of our golf course.

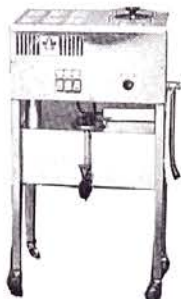
