From the Superintendent

Tee Marker Placement

Tee markers are an essential feature of each tee. They are utilized to designate the area from which play begins on each hole for a given day. Moving the tee markers in a planned pattern provides some variation in how individual holes are played from day to day and allows the turf manager to manipulate the distribution of traffic and divoting across the teeing area so as to avoid excessive damage to a given area, as well as to allow time for damaged areas to recover.

An attempt to keep the overall distance of the course as consistent as possible is made through a planned program of tee marker placement as well as cup placement on the putting greens. A typical program of tee marker rotation on an eighteen hole golf course involves placement of six tee markers behind the permanent tee markers, six at approximately the same length as the permanent tee markers, and six to the front; however this system is tough to follow on our course since most of the permanent yardage markers are located close together and near the rear of the teeing area.

Our policy is to place the tee markers near their matching permanent yardage markers on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Saturdays and Sundays and to use the remaining days to make use of the rest of the teeing surface. This system tends to make the course play short on Mondays, Thursdays, and Fridays, but is essential to tee maintenance.

Hope everyone is making use of the new tee signs which include handicaps and hole design drawings. The blue and red yardages correspond with the color-coded concrete blocks sunk into the surface of the teeing areas. These are permanent yardage markers and designate the spot from which the hole was measured and yardage ratings were given.

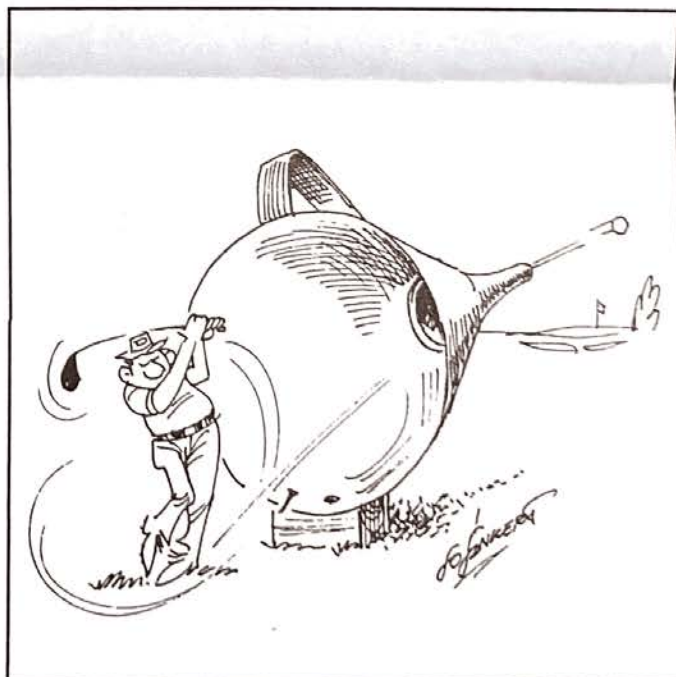

The conceptual drawings are posted on the bulletin board at the top of the stairs in the Clubhouse.

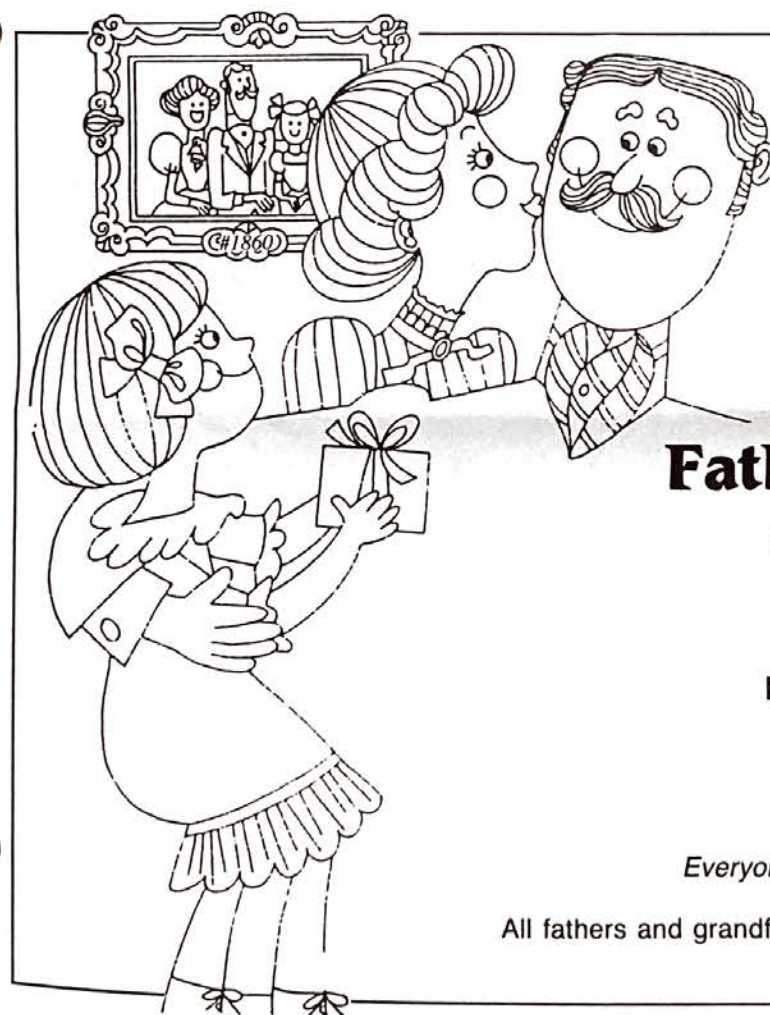

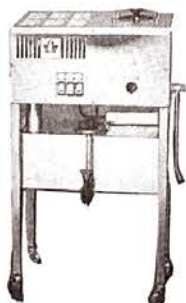
