From the President

A large number of concerns have been expressed by the Membership at large over the recent increase in Locker Rentals from \$40.00 to \$60.00. The rate change was approved at the Board of Directors meeting held on February 16, 1989. The Board may have been a little remiss in not communicating to the Membership the reasons behind the increase, before it was implemented.

The Ladies Locker Room over the past 6 to 8 months has undergone some major renovations. The Sauna has been removed, the area painted, new carpet installed, a new counter built, new bulletin boards installed and the construction of a new wall by the showers is in progress. Yet to be completed is the furnishing of the Locker Room with materials that fit with the new decor.

The House Committee also has plans to redecorate the Men's Locker Room. A Draftsman has assessed our present Locker Room facilities trying to utilize the space to the best advantage. He has proposed that we remove the Sauna and relocate the Handicap Counter in a different location. With this done and the Lockers rearranged an additional 34 Lockers can be provided in the space we have available.

Renovations would include painting the Locker Room, installation of new carpet, purchasing 34 new Lockers and the upgrading of the furnishings. With the renovations complete we would have a Locker Room to be proud of, not the threadbare maze we presently have.

Renovations to the Ladies Locker Room have cost approximately \$3,500 with new furnishings yet to be provided. The cost of renovations to the Men's Locker Room plus 34 new Lockers will run approximately \$15,000. The increase in the Locker Rental Fee was implemented to offset some of these improvement costs.

We as a Board apologize for the lack of communication in this regard. We trust that in light of the information contained in this article you can justify the Locker Rental increase.

A review of the procedures followed when booking Tee Times during the winter has led to a number of changes for the 1989 Season. The major changes are as follows:

- Members will have 3 day (72 hour) booking privileges
- Non-Members will have 2 day (48 hour) booking priveleges but cannot book during restricted periods
- Bookings on the Draw System will follow the same format but the Draw will be made Tuesday night rather than Thursday morning

These changes were made to try and utilize our course to full advantage, by accommodating our Members yet increasing golf revenues by allowing non-members to book and play during non-prime times. As a result of the increased revenue, the rates charged to Members will only have to increase moderately to maintain and improve our golf course.

Included in this month's Georgian are the detailed procedures for dues paying Members booking tee times as well as the procedures for booking times on the draw system. We trust that you will familiarize yourself with the new procedures and that they have the desired effect of increasing participation in the great game we all love.

From the Superintendent

A bit of a late start due to all the snow we received this winter, but we're finally open and I would like to thank everyone for waiting patiently. The extra week of leaving the Greens covered has in past years ensured good playing conditions for the remainder of the Season. Our scheduled work on course improvements this year should not interfere with daily Golf activities. The list includes finishing the retaining wall around #3 pond, working on the new green for #17 and starting work on the new number 10, 11, and 12 holes. A small holding pond will be constructed in front of #16 green sometime later this fall.

Our cutting heights for the start of the year are as follows:

- 1. Greens at 1/4 inch
- 2. Tees at 9/16 inch
- 3. Fringes and Fairways at 3/4 inch
- 4. Rough at 1 3/4 inch

Some heights will be lowered slightly as damaged areas on the Course fill in so let's hope the weather stays good and the Course recovers quickly so that everyone can have a great summer of Golf.

Weekends & Holiday Equal Booking for Dues Paying Members

- The booking slip is completed by a designated Member of the group, it is then dropped in a box prior to the Wednesday preceding the weekend.
- 2. A minimum of three names required on the booking slip.
- Tuesday night the slips are drawn one at a time from the box and the times are recorded on the booking sheets.
- 4. The Member delegated to complete the booking slip must phone the Pro Shop after 9:00 a.m. Wednesday morning to confirm the time given. He then can phone the rest of his four-some informing them of their tee time.
- Those who did not fill out a time slip may phone after 9:00 a.m. and book by phone or in person on Wednesday.
- Groups do not always request the same times each Saturday and Sunday morning, thus making it possible to have an even spread of tee times from 7:00 a.m. till approximately 10:30 a.m.
- By ticking off earlier or later on the booking slips the Pro Shop uses its judgement to allocate a time if it has been taken by another group.

Dues Paying Members

1. Weekends & Holidays

The Pro Shop will take phone calls after 9:00 a.m. each day to book times 72 hours in advance

Bookings will not be taken between 4:30 p.m. and

Bookings will not be taken between 4:30 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. weekdays from anyone other than dues paying Members

2. Saturdays & Sundays

Times may be booked from 9:00 a.m. Wednesday

3. Wednesday Men's Only

Noon - 6:30 p.m.

Wednesday, Men's Day is for dues paying Members and out of town guests ONLY

4. Tuesday Ladies

8:30 a.m. - 11:00 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. - 6:00 p.m.

- Non-Members will have two-day booking privileges but cannot book during restricted periods.
- 6. All Golfers teeing off on 1st or 10th tees must have clearance from the Pro Shop. The Pro Shop has the overriding authority to use the tees as he deems proper, giving full consideration to the pleasure of those with booked times, or already on the course. The course should be utilized to the fullest degree. The Pro Shop is instructed to put players groups into fours where-ever possible. For further information please contact your captains.
- Juniors may book time for play on weekends between 1:00 p.m. 1:30 p.m. in accordance with Member priveleges.
 On all other days juniors have no booking privileges, however, efforts should be made to get them on the course when tees are free.

Golf Course

HOUSE RULES & REGULATIONS

- All Members and Green Fee players must be dressed in a manner that will uphold the dignity of the Club at all times.
- 2) Shirts must be worn at all times.
- Only tailored shorts wil be allowed on the course. Cutoffs, athletic type shorts, etc. will not be permitted.
- 4) Ladies are not permitted to wear midriff or bra type tops.
- Only Golf shoes or running shoes are allowed on the course; no boots or high heeled shoes will be permitted.
- 6) Children under the age of 16 are not permitted on the course, unless he or she is a registered junior member of the Club, or accompanied by an adult 19 years of age or older, or a participant in a Club sanctioned event. Children under the age of 6 are not permitted on the course at anytime, nor are non-participating juniors under 16. (Authorized caddies shall be the exception to the Rule)
- Green Fee tickets must be carried on the course at all times.
- Each person in a foursome must have a set of clubs and a bag.
- All carts and cars must be kept off trees, greens, and out of sandtraps.
- Only 2 persons and 2 golf bags are permitted on a car at one time.
- No Player should play until participants in front are out of range.
- Participants must replace divots, repair ball marks and rake sand traps after use.
- Language and conduct should be kept under control at all times.
- 14) Rules of play shall be governed y the rules and regulations as set out by the R.C.G.A. and the Club's local rules.

It is the duty of every Member of the Club and guests to familiarize themselves with the Club rules and regulations, as ignorance thereof shall not excuse a member for any breach or neglect of the same.

Dress Code

- All members and green fee players must be dressed in a manner that will uphold the dignity of the Club at all times.




