## From The Superintendent

Last month's article which listed cutting heights and maintenance schedules did not include reasons why some mornings you will find greens uncut and holes unchanged.

Greens are left uncut the morning following an application of fertilizer. The greens are either dry cut without baskets in the afternoon or not cut at all to prevent picking up any particles of fertilizer. This occurs once every three weeks.

Greens are left uncut following a heavy rainfall when mower damage to the surface is likely to occur. They are also left uncut from time to time to help minimize soil compaction and turfgrass wear caused by the heavy tri-plex mowers.

Holes are changed on a regular basis to spread wear evenly over the entire surface of the green and to provide a smooth, neat hole which is conducive to good putting. A problem arises when the surface area of the green is too small to allow old holes to recover before a new hole must be cut nearby. For this reason, we feel that leaving a hole unchanged for two days is less stressful to the grass than moving it to an area where proper recovery has not occurred.

The conditions mentioned above are possible on a Monday, Thursday or Friday when golfing activities are not normally of a tournament nature.

## Assessment Options

### REGULAR MEMBERSHIPS

*As a Club Member, you have the following options:*

- Plan #A \$7.50 per month Club Charge: applicable to Seniors 65 or better and club members who reside outside of a 50 mile radius of Prince George.
- Plan #B \$15.00 per month Club Charge: applicable to all active members of the Society except those set out in Plan A.
- Plan #C Dormant Accounts: available to all Memberships both Corporate and Regular. Certificates in a dormant status do not receive Club mailings and cannot be used at any time unless re-activated and authorized by the Board. At the time of re-activation a fee may be applicable and an active plan would have to be chosen. Members who are granted a dormant account are not required to pay assessments.

*Note: Dormant accounts will have last rights and privileges should a Waiting List for playing privileges in sporting activities be implemented.*

Club members are reminded that whatever plan they choose, the Charge becomes a regular part of their account and is governed by our By-Laws: Non-payment could result in suspension of all privileges.

If you have any questions or require any explanations on any of the assessment plans please contact the Club Manager at 563-0357.

Section 8. (1) of the Constitution and By-Laws which govern the operation of regular members' accounts states:

8. (1) The secretary shall cause members' bills or accounts to be mailed to them by the 8th day of the month following the month in which they were incurred and if a member fails to pay any indebtedness to the Society within thirty (30) days after the bill for the same has been mailed to the member the member (and if the member is a corporate member, then the corporate member and its designate) shall by reason of such default be suspended from all membership privileges until the member's indebtedness and any reinstatement fee has been paid in full. Upon such default the directors may cause the member's name and amount of indebtedness to be posted on the bulletin board in the clubhouse and a notice of default in writing shall be sent to the member and if the member is a corporate member, its designate. If such indebtedness and reinstatement fee, if any, is not paid within fifteen (15) days of the mailing of such notice, the delinquent member shall forfeit all rights and privileges of membership and cease to be a member of the Society, but such members may, upon satisfactory explanation, be reinstated as a member by a majority vote of the directors upon payment of all indebtedness to the Society at date of suspension, and any reinstatement and/or penalty fees set from time to time by the directors.
