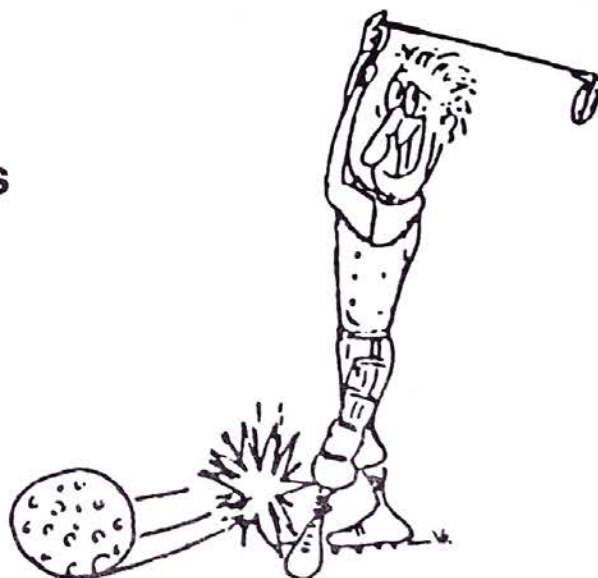

From the Superintendent

With the help of much rain and some recent sunshine, the greens have filled in nicely. They are putting smoother and faster now that the aeration holes have filled in and the cutting height has been lowered to 3/16 inch. The following is a list of all cutting heights and maintenance schedules.

1. Greens - cut daily at 3/16 inch.
2. Tees & Fringes - cut Monday, Wednesday and Friday at 9/16 inch.
3. Fairways - continuous daily cutting at 3/4 inch.
4. Rough - cut Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday at 1 1/2 inches.

Morning cutting is the rule but some afternoon and evening cutting will be practised because the grass is dry and a much better quality of cut can be achieved.

Irrigation cycles are run nightly as needed. When rainfall is minimal, irrigation is needed 24 hours a day. In this case, greens and tees are watered at night and fairways and rough are watered during the day.

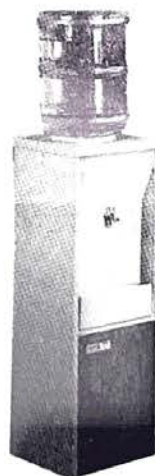

From the Board of Directors

Further to our President's message in the May Georgian, the Board has refined and developed a long term Business Plan to enhance and meet the needs of our facilities.

The following Cash Flow Analysis outlines the 1987, 1988 and 1989 Actuals as well as the Plan for 1990. The cash flow

includes revenues generated from operations less our debt servicing requirements. The surplus is the amount available for capital expenditures and major renovations to existing facilities. We are sure you will agree that the residual amount is not sufficient to maintain a facility with a present value of approximately five million dollars.

From the Board of Directors

Everyone is aware of our current Assessments; these options were supplemented many years ago and are no longer effective in the current business environment. For your information these options have generated only \$21,000 in 1987, \$22,000 in 1988, \$17,000 in 1989 and \$13,000 in 1990. **Effective August 1, 1990**, the current Assessment Options will be deemed redun-

dant and will no longer be in effect.

In order to generate the revenue for the capital expenditures as noted above, the Board of Directors will be instituting **NEW Assessment Options effective August 1, 1990** and are listed as follows:

ASSESSMENT OPTIONS

REGULAR MEMBERSHIPS & CORPORATE MEMBERSHIPS

As a Club Member, you have the following options:

Plan A \$7.50 per month Club Charge: applicable to seniors 65 or better and Club Members who reside outside of a 50 mile radius of Prince George.

Plan B \$15.00 per month Club Charge: applicable to all active Members of the Society except those set out in Plan A.

Plan C Dormant Accounts: available to all Memberships both Corporate and Regular. Certificates in a Dormant Status do not receive Club mailings and cannot be used at any time unless re-activated and authorized by the Board. At the time of re-activation a \$300.00 fee is applicable and an active Plan would have to be chosen; i.e., Plan A or Plan B. Members who are granted a Dormant Account are not required to pay Assessments.

Note: Dormant Accounts will have last rights and privileges should a Waiting List for playing privileges in sporting activities be implemented.

The Board of Directors is committed to maintaining and improving your Club. The Business Plan presented goes a long way toward accomplishing our goals. Should you as a Member

have any ideas or suggestions *which in your opinion would enhance this Plan we would be pleased to hear from you on the attached.*
