From the Superintendent

Many of you avid golfers, I'm sure, are familiar with words such as Poa annua and Creeping Bentgrass. These, of course, are types of grasses found on golf courses throughout the world. Of the over twenty different species of grass available for use in our cool season climate, only a half dozen or so are suitable for use on the golf course. Here is a brief description of the three main types you will find on our course.

1. Annual Bluegrass (Poa annua):

Annual bluegrass is generally classified as a turfgrass weed and is rarely included in seed mixtures for turfgrass use. Nevertheless, it will frequently invade, persist and become a major component of irrigated, close cut, intensely fertilized turfs. It has a number of desirable features such as its ability to survive low cutting heights and the ability for its seeds to germinate quickly even at cool temperatures. However, these desirable features are overshadowed by the fact that its tolerances to extreme temperatures, submersion and ice cover are extremely low.

Poa annua is light green to greenish-yellow in color and can be found on all parts of our course.

2. Creeping Bentgrass (Agrostis palustris):

Creeping bentgrass is the most desirable grass available for use on closely mowed surfaces such as bowling and putting greens. It is one of the most hardy cool season turf grasses in temperature extremes and its creeping growth habit make it a quick healer of divots and ball marks.

All greens were initially established in bentgrass; however, over the years they have become overrun with annual bluegrass. Bentgrasses are dark green to blue-green in color.

3. Kentucky Bluegrass (Poa pratensis):

Kentucky bluegrass forms a medium textured, green to dark green turf of good shoot density. The aggressive sod forming nature of Kentucky bluegrass is attributed to vigorous rhizome development which initiates new shoots and roots from each node. It is commonly used on lawns, parks and cemeteries as well as golf courses.

Kentucky bluegrass can be found on our tees, fairways and rough areas. It does best when cut at a height of 1 to 2 inches but new varieties are being developed which can be cut down to 1/2 inch. Two of its most desirable features are its ability to withstand extreme cold and to heal itself by means of its spreading type growth habit. Because Kentucky bluegrass is slow to germinate and establish a complete ground cover, it is often used in a seed mixture with fescue and ryegrass. Perennial ryegrass, for example, will germinate within three days and therefore is used as the major component of our divot filling seed mix.

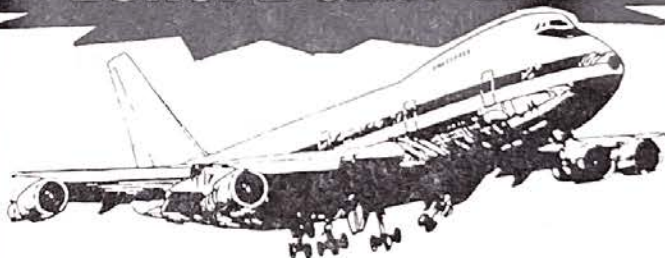
All comments were "excellent", "good time" and "great evening." With that in mind, we will definitely be planning some Men's Nights and skins games for next year. Keep posted.

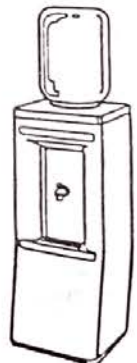
