From the Superintendent

With the warmer weather, we pushed the snow off the greens starting on Monday, February 28, 1994. It took Glen 3½ days to clear the snow off the old greens.

Once the snow was off the greens and the temperature warmed up we were able to push the ice off the greens. It took two weeks to get the ice off the old greens, with the exception of four days during that period, we pushed ice every day. The greens are very wet after the ice comes off so I let them dry out a little before I cover them with tarps. All greens are fungicided to prevent any development of disease.

With the golf season approaching, some things to remind you about:

- replace all divots
- repair ball marks
- keep power and pull carts outside white lines
- when leaving #4 to go to #6 tee, please avoid crossing in front of #16 green. Stay to cart path.

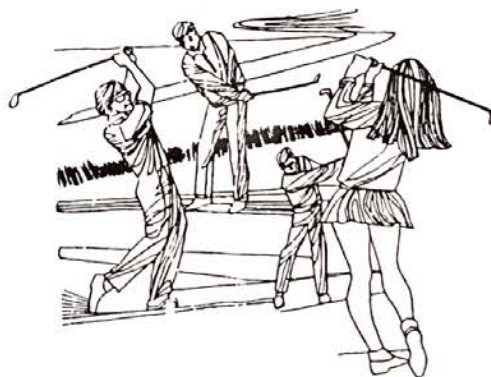
