### **Construction Report**

With the recent completion of #13 green, I'd like to take this time to answer some of the questions I was asked during the construction process. The first question is, "Why do we have to rebuild in the first place?"

There are a number of problems that exist with the old greens, the most critical being drainage. It's essential that a green have both surface & subsurface drainage for optimum growing conditions.

Surface drainage is important because it removes excess water from the putting surface - rain in summer and most importantly when the course is going through the freeze/thaw period that happens every spring. Our present greens weren't designed to remove water from the surface of the green, allowing water and ice to form and result in winter kill and slow recovery.

Subsurface drainage is important for the overall health of the grass plant and root system, for this is the zone the plant lives in. Most of the old greens were constructed using very heavy soils and in many of them there is a clay layer ranging from 4" to 6" thickness. It's the clay layer beneath the surface we are most concerned with. The most pronounced adverse effect of layers and heavy soils is the rate of water movement going through them is reduced or stopped altogether. This is expressed as reduced infiltration or percolation.

The presence of this excess water also results in the absence of oxygen. Because every living cell in a root must have oxygen 24 hours a day for respiration, the result is poor or shallow rooting and even root dieback. A variety of secondary problems may also arise, such as the promotion of poa annua, greens that are slow to recover each spring, prone to disease and a less drought tolerant turf.

I think it's safe to say that at some point in time, our greens have shown some if not all of the above symptoms. This brings to us to "How do we build new greens?"

Great advances have been made in greens construction over the past twenty years. Research by the United States Golf Association and other groups has been aimed at providing optimum, green construction techniques. A modern, well-built green will drain in all weather conditions, resist compaction, putt firm and true and hold an approach shot without excessive watering


Most architects, builders, and superintendents regard the U.S.G.A. type green the optimum green construction technique. In this method, the sub-grade contours of the green, the traps and shoulders are fashioned. This sub-grade is shaped exactly as the finished grade is intended, making sure that positive surface drainage is achieved. A greens pitch should be between 2% and 4% to provide a good drainage and still be a fair test of golf. Drainage trenches are then dug in using a herring bone or grid pattern spaced 15 to 20 feet on centre. A setting bed of gravel is placed in the trench, the drain pipe is laid (4" Big O drain line), and the trenches are backfilled to the top with pea gravel. Then a 4" layer of pea gravel is placed over the entire green surface. A 2" layer of course sand is placed on top of this. Finally, a 12" layer of best washed sand available is placed at the

root zone. Grade-stakes are used to keep each layer uniform over the entire green surface. After the finished grade is completed and fertilizer is applied, we are ready for seed or sod.

The interface between the course sand and the pea gravel layers in a U.S.G.A. green section creates a perched water table that allows water to pond above the interface until sufficient pressure is exerted by the water to initiate drainage through drain lines and out off the green.

#13 Green was sodded using our bent grass nursery. This sod went down very well and at this time is knitting together ahead of our expectations. We hope to play #13 Green early next spring if mother nature is kind to us.

It takes a lot of work and planning to bring a project like this together and I'd like to thank a couple of people who made #13 a success. First I would like to thank my staff for all their hard work especially Jay who shared the vision and making my job a lot easier. On behalf of the Prince George Golf & Curling Club, I would like to thank Ron Magrath and Coast Tractor for their generous donation of a loader to assist this project.



I have included a ross section of a green built to U.S.G.A. specifications and a drainage system.

I hope this has answered some of your questions and given you some insight as to why and how our greens are being rebuilt.
