Bylaw Amendments

ATTENTION: The Board of Directors

RE: 1995 BYLAW AMENDMENTS

As a member and as the solicitor for the Society, I would like the following motion placed before the Annual General Meeting of the Society:

BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

(a) That bylaw 1(2) which reads as follows:

"The definitions in the Society Act on the date these bylaws become effective apply to these bylaws."

be deleted, and the following be inserted in its place and stead:

"The definitions in the Society Act as amended from time to time apply to these bylaws."

(b) That the word "on" in line 2 of bylaw 6(2) be deleted and the word "in" be inserted in its place and stead so that bylaw 6(2) will read as follows:

"Only a person who has attained the age of nineteen years shall be eligible for membership in the Society."

(c) That the word "awarded" be inserted after the word "be" in line 1 of bylaw 6(4)(a) so that bylaw 6(4)(a) will read as follows:

"A life membership in the Society may be awarded to any person who in the opinion of the directors has performed a signal service to the Society. Notwithstanding bylaw 37, such an award must be approved by unanimous vote of the directors."

(d) That the fourth sentence of bylaw 10(3) which reads as follows:

"The member whose certificate is transferred under (iii) preceding shall be entitled to the return of his membership joining fee less FIFTY (\$50.00) DOLLARS for the year or portion thereof from the date of issue of the certificate or from May 1st, 1979, whichever is the later date."

be deleted, and that the following be inserted in its place and stead:

"The member whose certificate is transferred under this clause shall be entitled to the return of his mem-

bership joining fee less FIFTY (\$50.00) DOLLARS for each year or portion thereof from the date of issue of the certificate to the date of such transfer."

(e) That the word "be" in line 1 of bylaw 51 be deleted and the word "by" be inserted in its place and stead so that bylaw 51 will read as follows:

"The members may by special resolution restrict the borrowing powers of the directors, but a restriction imposed expires at the next annual general meeting."

(f) That the word "esignate" in line 1 of bylaw 60(1)(a) be deleted and the word "designate" be inserted in its place and stead so that bylaw 60(1)(a) will read as follows:

"every member and designate of a corporate member shown on the register of members on the day notice is given; and"

I consider the foregoing proposals to be in the nature of housekeeping amendments only, and I do not think there will be any opposition to them from the members at the Annual General Meeting.

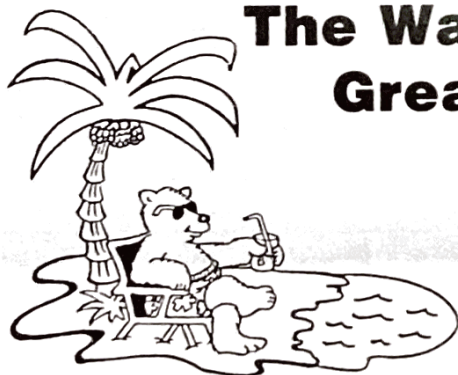

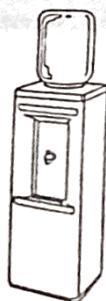

With most of the summer behind us, I will be preparing the course for winter over the next few months. Aside from the changes in the fertilizer program and the applying of fungicides, I will be aerating the golf course. I will aerate the greens and tees starting on Monday, September 16. After aerating the greens and tees, they will be topdressed in order to reduce any thatch accumulation and maintain a good soil profile.

I will be aerating the fairways starting in early October. Although these procedures cause undesirable playing conditions, they are necessary in providing healthy turfgrass for better playing conditions throughout the year.

I have noticed in the past, both power and pull carts straying from the cart paths. Cart paths are put in to control wear damage to the turfgrass from excessive traffic. I ask that all pull and power carts please use cart paths to help minimize damage from traffic.

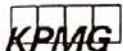

AUDITORS' REPORT TO THE MEMBERS

We have audited the combined balance sheet of the Prince George Golf & Curling Club as at April 30, 1995 and the combined statements of operations and surplus and changes in financial position for the year then ended. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Club's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

We conducted our audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that we plan and perform an audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation.

As explained in note 1 to the financial statements, the Club does not record depreciation on capital assets, and reduces capital assets by the amount of their proceeds from disposal. Generally accepted accounting principles require that capital assets be depreciated, and that disposals of capital assets be recorded at their original cost net of accumulated depreciation. The effects of these departures from generally accepted accounting principles on these combined financial statements have not been determined.

In our opinion, except for the failure to record depreciation on capital assets, and except that disposals of capital assets are recorded in the amount of proceeds received rather than original cost net of accumulated depreciation, as explained in the preceding paragraph, these combined financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the combined financial position of the Club as at April 30, 1995 and the results of its combined operations and changes in its combined financial position for the year then ended in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. As required by the Societies Act of the Province of British Columbia, we report that, in our opinion, these principles have been applied on a basis consistent with that of the preceding year.

Our audit was conducted for the purpose of forming an opinion on the basic financial statements taken as a whole. The current year's supplementary information included in the Schedules is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the basic financial statements. Such supplementary information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the basic financial statements and, in our opinion, is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the basic financial statements taken as a whole.

Notes to Combined Financial Statements

Year ended April 30, 1995

1. Significant accounting policies:

(a) Principles of combination:

The combined financial statements include the assets and liabilities of Prince George Golf & Curling Club, Prince George Golf and Country Club Ltd., and Prince George Curling Club Ltd. The net assets of these organizations have been combined as they are under common control and management. Investment and loans between these organizations have been eliminated.

All of the above organizations are exempt from income taxes due to their status as non-profit organizations.

(b) Inventory:

Inventory is valued at the lower of cost and net realizable value, with cost calculated on a first-in, first-out basis.

(c) Capital assets:

Capital assets are stated at cost less government grants and proceeds received on disposal. Donated capital assets, including donated services utilized in the construction of capital assets, are capitalized at the estimated fair value thereof.

No provision is made for depreciation of capital assets. The accumulated depreciation balance is a carry forward amount from the Prince George Golf and Country Club Ltd. whose policy prior to assumption of operations by the Prince George Golf & Curling Club in June of 1972 was to depreciate capital assets.

(d) Deferred revenue:

Deferred revenue represents golf dues received which pertain to next year's golf season.

(e) Membership fees:

Initial membership fees are recorded as equity. Annual dues are recorded as revenue.

2. Cash allocated for future capital expenditures:

During the year the Club's Board of Directors passed a motion which requires proceeds from the levy of assessments on members of the Club to be placed into a separate bank account for the purpose of financing future capital expenditures.
