Annual General Meeting Resolutions

Resolution 1: To change bylaw 6(1) to read; "The classes of membership in the Society shall be regular, corporate, life and inactive."

Resolution 2: To add new section 7(5) to read;

(a) A regular member in good standing may submit written application to the Board of Directors to request their account be changed from regular to inactive. Upon acceptance by the Board of Directors and payment of required fees, their account will become inactive. (b) Any regular account that is currently considered "Dormant" will have until April 30, 1998 to submit to the Society their request to be placed in the inactive category. Upon receipt of required fees, their account will automatically be placed in the inactive category. (c) To be accepted as inactive, the regular account must be paid in full upon board approval of change of category. (d) A yearly fee shall be paid each year prior to May 1 to maintain an inactive account. This fee shall be \$125.00 per year and will cover the ensuing year. The fee will be set by the Board of Directors and may be changed from time to time. (e) An inactive account shall not be entitled to vote, maintain charging privileges, receive reduced playing fees or any other privilege received by regular, corporate or life membership. An inactive account will continue to receive a copy of the Georgian. (f) An inactive account may be changed to regular with written application and payment of appropriate fees as set by the Board of Directors from time to time.

Resolution 3: To accept the consolidated bylaws of the Society plus resolutions 1 and 2 as the official bylaws of the Society.

for the Year ended April 30, 1997

AUDITORS' REPORT TO THE MEMBERS

We have audited the combined balance sheet of the Prince George Golf & Curling Club as at April 30, 1997 and the combined statements of operations and surplus and changes in financial position for the year then ended. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Club's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

We conducted our audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that we plan and perform an audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation.

As explained in note 1 to the financial statements, the Club does not record depreciation on capital assets, and reduces capital assets, other than land, by the amount of their proceeds from disposal. Generally accepted accounting principles require that capital assets be depreciated, and that disposals of capital assets be recorded at their original cost net of accumulated depreciation. The effects of these departures from generally accepted accounting principles on these combined financial statements have not been determined.

In our opinion, except for the failure to record depreciation on capital assets, and except that disposals of capital assets are recorded in the amount of proceeds received rather than original cost net of accumulated depreciation, as explained in the preceding paragraph, these combined financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the combined financial position of the Club as at April 30, 1997 and the results of its combined operations and changes in its combined financial position for the year then ended in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. As required by the Societies Act of the Province of British Columbia, we report that, in our opinion, these principles have been applied on a basis consistent with that of the preceding year.

Our audit was conducted for the purpose of forming an opinion on the basic financial statements taken as a whole. The current year's supplementary information included in the Schedules is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the basic financial statements. Such supplementary information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the basic financial statements and, in our opinion, is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the basic financial statements taken as a whole.

Notes to Combined Financial Statements

Year ended April 30, 1997

1. Significant accounting policies:

(a) Principles of combination:

The combined financial statements include the assets and liabilities of Prince George Golf & Curling Club, Prince George Golf and Country Club Ltd., and Prince George Curling Club Ltd. The net assets of these organizations have been combined as they are under common control and management. Investment and loans between these organizations have been eliminated.

All of the above organizations are exempt from income taxes due to their status as non-profit organizations.

(b) Inventory:

Inventory is valued at the lower of cost and net realizable value, with cost calculated on a firstin, first-out basis.

(c) Capital assets:

Land is stated at cost. All other capital assets are stated at cost less government grants and proceeds received on disposal. Donated capital assets, including donated services utilized in the construction of capital assets, are capitalized at the estimated fair value thereof.

No provision is made for depreciation of capital assets. The accumulated depreciation balance is a carry forward amount from the Prince George Golf and Country Club Ltd. whose policy prior to assumption of operations by the Prince George Golf & Curling Club in June of 1972 was to depreciate capital assets.

(d) Deferred revenue:

Deferred revenue represents golf dues received which pertain to next year's golf season.

(e) Membership fees:

Initial membership fees are recorded as equity. Annual dues are recorded as revenue.

(f) Financial instruments

During the year the Club retroactively adopted new accounting recommendations for the presentation and disclosure of financial instruments. The adoption of these new recommendations has not changed the earnings of the Club as previously reported.

Where applicable, comments with respect to financial instruments appear in the relevant note. The fair values of financial instruments are indicated where they differ materially from their carrying values.

Cash allocated for future capital expenditures is comprised of proceeds from the levy of assessments on members of the Club required, pursuant to a resolution by the Club's Board of Directors in fiscal 1995, to be set aside to finance capital acquisitions. Current year assessments in excess of capital acquisitions were applied to reimburse operating cash for capital acquisitions in excess of assessments in fiscal 1996.

Funds held in trust are comprised of cash generated from the sale of land to Kelfor Holdings Ltd. net of \$110,000 used to reimburse operating cash for capital acquisitions, and will be applied to the purchase of the Rotary Stadium lands from the City of Prince George (see note 3).

3. Land:

In prior years the Prince George Golf & Curling Club, Prince George Golf and Country Club Ltd. and Prince George Curling Club Ltd. entered into agreements with the City of Prince George ("the City") and Kelfor Holdings Ltd. ("Kelfor") regarding the sale and purchase of certain pieces of land. One of these lots was sold to Kelfor during the year for total consideration of \$567.400.

As part of the agreement with the City, Prince George Golf and Country Club Ltd. is required to purchase the Rotary Stadium lands adjacent to the golf course. The purchase price will equal the appraised value of this land and has yet to be determined. The date of purchase is dependent upon satisfactory arrangements being made for current users of the land, and is expected to be completed in the latter part of 1997.

Of the proceeds received from Kelfor, S857,400 is being held in trust in a separate interest bearing account for the benefit of Prince George Golf and Country Club Ltd. to be used for the purchase as described above. The remaining \$110,000 has been drawn by the Prince George Golf & Curling Club to partially fund current and prior years' capital acquisitions. Upon completion of the purchase of the Rotary Stadium lands from the City, the \$110,000 will be converted to a loan, to be secured by an interest-free mortgage and repaid in equal annual instalments to the City over five years commencing on the first anniversary of the purchase of the Rotary Stadium lands. Any excess of proceeds received from the sale of land to Kelfor over the cost of the Rotary Stadium lands will be contributed to the City to assist with the cost of relocating current users.

3. Land, continued:

Any subsequent sale of the Rotary Stadium lands will be subject to compliance with the restrictive covenant imposed by the City on all the Club's land whereby the City has right of approval of sale, and proceeds must be used first to settle any registered charge against the land, second in payment of debts incurred in developing facilities on the land, and third to acquire or develop other recreational land as agreed to by the City.

- a) The Club has a contract with its golf professional which requires payment of \$30,000 per year for a period of five years. The current agreement expires on November 1, 1998.
- The club is committed to the purchase of the Rotary Stadium lands from the City of Prince George (see note 3).

7. Subsequent event:

Subsequent to year-end the Club entered into a lease agreement for new computer equipment, calling for monthly lease payments of approximately \$1,900 for thirty-six months with an option to purchase the equipment at the end of the lease term for approximately \$6,100.



Are you 50 years and over? Like to Curl? Female or Male we welcome you into our Tuesday or Thursday 1:00 pm curling league. We elect our own executive and run our own events. The main purpose of the leagues is to have fun curling, socializing after curling or at a number of special events held throughout the year. It makes the winter shorter and more enjoyable.
