Manager's Report

Golf:

Unfortunately the golf season is almost done for this year. It has been a great run. Despite the weather, we have had more than 40 thousand rounds of golf played on our course this past season.

We are getting ready to winterize the golf course. Tarps have been made - the flax straw is here - the fungicides are in stock the only thing that we are waiting for now is the right weather conditions.

We are seeking professional guidance on the safety issues surrounding the new practice green and the area around #7 green and #8 tee box. As soon as we have a solution in place, the areas affected will be brought back into play. These improvements are scheduled to be completed before the next golf season. Thank you for your co-operation.

For those of you who might have missed the earlier announcement, Ted Locke has been retained as our architectural consultant to help us design a golf course which we all can be proud of. The consensus at this time is that all major reconstruction will be put on hold until an overall plan is put into place.

Jim Ross, from the Prairie Turf Grass Research Centre, was here on October 5th. His preliminary comments were very favorable. He indicated that the health of our turf has improved to a point beyond where he expected it to be at this time. It appears that we are headed in the right direction.

Thanks to Murray, Laurie and their staff for a great golf season.

Restaurant and Lounge:

We are introducing some new features. Starting in November we will be introducing a "Breakfast Club". Participants will have the opportunity to win a trip for two to Vancouver. I apologize to you, the curlers, for any inconveniences that you may have encountered thus far in the curling season. Tammy,


Murray and J.C. are working hard on eliminating all the challenges that they are faced with. Your assistance in providing information to them as soon as it's available would help immensely. Thank you.




GOLF REPORT





From the Curling Department

As you know, the rocks from sheets 5 - 8 have been sent away to have new ceramic inserts attached.

We have been asked why we didn't send them away during the summer months. During last year's final bonspiels, there were numerous complaints about the trial (ceramic) rocks that we were using on sheets 2 and 3. The trial rocks with granite inserts arrived at the end of the season, too late for a proper assessment.

The Curling Committee agreed that to make such a large purchase that we had better be well informed. At this time most curling clubs were closed and we wanted to speak with clubs that had purchased new curling rocks from our intended supplier. With 4 sheets of rocks available from the old building to use, we thought it prudent to delay the decision until we could speak with these clubs.

We have decided to purchase the ceramic inserts for several reasons: a 20 year warranty as opposed to 10 year for granite and the success from clubs that have purchased them. Victoria Curling Club researched their purchase for more than a year and have now played a complete year with them and are very pleased with the results.


The rocks are currently in transit to Winnipeg and will require approximately 8 working days to apply the new surfaces. We hope to have the rocks back in play by mid to late November.

Please remember that the rocks from the old building are over 35 years old so there will be some inconsistency in shots but also remember that up until last year we all had to play in the barn at least once a month and faced the same challenge. Lets treat this as a challenge; heavier in the early ends and swingy in the later ends.

Let's have fun and look forward to the new rocks next month!
